We will begin with a breath-based centering practice and discussion of how and why we will use such practices throughout our sessions, drawing on the work of Resmaa Menakem. Each person will further introduce themselves using the object or picture brought along as a symbol of an “ethics ancestor” you carry with you on this trip. We will work through an activity, “Moment of Dissent,” toward developing a covenant together that expresses the culture of graceful learning and respectful presence-ing we intend for our group. We’ll have time for questions and conversations about logistical matters, and close with the sharing of “hineini texts” (Gil) and “Matthew 25 ethics” (Joyce).</i></p>	<p><u>Location:</u> Reinhardtstraßen--Höfe conference center, room RI</p>	<p>In preparation for this session, make sure you have with you the photo/object through which you will further introduce yourself (as discussed in the zoom pre-trip session). Remember that your “ethics ancestor” could be a specific person or group of people, or it might be a turning point event that has formed and informed you. Think about how you will use that object or photo not to introduce the group to that other person or event per se, but rather to facilitate and focus your telling of a 3 minute story about yourself in light of that person’s impact or that event’s power in your life. 11:15 – 12:30pm	<p>Session 11: Creating/Destroying the Other – Joyce Mercer, Gil Steinlauf</p> <p><i>This session considers religious/theological and psychological dynamics of "othering" as the background for dehumanization, with the construction of monstrosity as an extreme projection of otherness. We turn to visual art--specifically to artists who collaborated with the Nazi regime-- for micro-case studies of the other--and in particular the creation of monsters whose threat justifies their destruction. As Reinhold Heller put it, "Without the pejorative Jewish image, the German ideal could not be purposefully visualized." We will discuss how such artistic examples of creating legitimacy for genocide stand parallel to examples of religious professionals who lent their roles and expertise to the construction of Jews-as-(Monstrous)-Others in ways that laid the groundwork for the Holocaust agenda of "exterminating" Jews. Or, to look and the process of othering from a different direction, Hhow might the act of "othering" and its extreme form of constucting others as monsters participate in efforts to avoid identifying with the perpetrators of injustice?
