



Rabbi Amy Wallk, PhD, has served as the Senior Rabbi of Temple Beth El (Springfield, MA) since 2008. In addition to her work at Temple Beth El, Rabbi Wallk serves on the Rabbinical Assembly's Executive Board and the RA's Va'ad HaKavod (Standing Committee on upholding established standards). Rabbi Wallk served on the Editorial Board for the Conservative Movement's Shabbat and Holiday Prayerbook, *Lev Shalem*, and she is the "Conservative voice" for Moment Magazine's "Ask the Rabbi" monthly column. She also teaches on-line courses through the Melton School of Adult Jewish Learning. Rabbi Wallk is on the Rabbinic Cabinet for Givat Haviva, a civil society organization and educational center in Israel dedicated to promoting reconciliation, coexistence, and a shared society between Israel's Jewish and Arab citizens.

Rabbi Wallk has participated in multiple exceptional programs of professional development: The National Jewish Center for Learning and Leadership's Rabbis Without Borders, the Mandel Teacher Educator Institute, the Institute for Jewish Spirituality's Clergy Leadership Program, and the Shalom Hartman Institute's Rabbinic Leadership Institute. Each of these experiences has helped Rabbi Wallk refine her thinking about Jewish education, building sacred community, sustaining a vibrant Israel & Zionism, and shaping the synagogue in the 21st century.

Rabbi Wallk received rabbinical ordination from the Jewish Theological Seminary of America and a Doctorate in Education from Michigan State University. In addition she holds a Masters Degree in Journalism from Northwestern University and in Jewish Education from the University of Judaism.
